# DEMONSTRATING OUR IMPACT



## ACADEMIC SUCCESS

### *The Need*

21% of young people in Los Angeles County fail to graduate from high school on time.

### *What We Do*

Caring staff provide homework support and fun educational programs, while mentoring and inspiring youth to achieve academic success.

### *Our Impact*

Among Club teens, 99% expect to graduate from high school and 83% expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

### *The Need*

16% of high-school youth in California were involved in a physical fight in the past year.<sup>3</sup>

### *What We Do*

Guide youth to become responsible, caring citizens; acquiring leadership skills through planning & decision-making opportunities that contribute to our Club and community.

### *Our Impact*

81% of Club youth said they stand up for what is right; 84% reported that as a leader, they make sure everyone feels important.

## HEALTH & WELLNESS

### *The Need*

37% of young people ages 12-17 in Los Angeles County are overweight or obese.<sup>4</sup>

### *What We Do*

Staff lead programs and activities that develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors to nurture their well being, set personal goals and grow into self-sufficient adults.

### *Our Impact*

66% of Club members ages 9 and older report getting at least one hour of physical activity five or more days per week.
